What is EMAS ?

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A voluntary environmental management scheme instrument designed by the European Commission and backed by an <u>EU Regulation</u>



EMAS stands for



Transparency and Accountability

Environmental Statement public on an EU register

Credibility and compliance

<u>Accredited/licensed environmental verifiers</u> check the reported data as well as compliance with environmental legislation

Innovation and Continuous Improvement

A <u>community of practice</u> to exchange good examples and innovate in reducing environmental impact

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EMAS registrations in the tourism sector



- EMAS registration can be requested by any company in the tourism value chain
- EMAS registered companies from accommodation, catering, transport, cultural and art facilities transport to parks and botanical and zoological gardens
- Over 397 tourism-related organisations registered to EMAS mainly in Germany, Spain, Italy but also outside EU
- Over 70% of EMAS registered organisations are SMEs !
